At the December Gathering, those present received a very special Christmas gift - - a copy of the recently published and updated Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order. While the Rule itself has not changed, the updates have to do with the new English Translation of the three-volume series, Francis of Assisi: Early Documents edited by Regis Armstrong OFM Cap., Wayne Hellmann, OFM Conv., and William J. Short, OFM, published between 1999-2001. The translation only affected the *Prologue of* the Rule. Footnotes have been added that are helpful to further understanding.


Included in the update of the Rule is a letter from Tibor Kauser, OFS, Minister

General of the Secular Franciscan Order dated June 24, 2018, the 40th anniversary of the Rule approved by Pope Blessed Paul VI on June 24, 2018. Excerpts from The Apostolic Letter of Approval, Seraphicas Patriarcha, are included also.

Reading, studying, loving, and living the Rule of the Secular Franciscan grounds us in our vocation as Secular Order Franciscans. In his letter of 2018, the Minister General, describes the rule as: a gift; a call, and invitation; a document of inspiration; a helping tool in the everyday; and a beauty and joy. He also challenges us to answer the questions:

> What is the Rule for me, in my personal life? What is the Rule for us as an International Fraternity, on all its levels? What does it mean for us to celebrate the Rule?

During the upcoming issues of the Newsletter there will be articles on the answers of our Fraternity to these questions and the questions found in the Celebrate the Rule Cards published by CIOFS. Theses can be found at info@secularfranciscansusa.org.
