
St. Anthony Fraternity to Join Franciscans Worldwide in Commemorating the Stigmata of St. Francis in 1224

On January 5, 2024 the Franciscan Family gathered in Rome for the solemn opening of the celebration of the eighth centenary of the Stigmata of St. Francis. This international event was broadcast live in Italian. Speakers from various countries spoke in their language. Tibor Kauser, OFS, General Minister of the Secular Franciscan Order spoke about how Francis was transformed through the stigmata to Christ, and that to live the gospel is to be like Christ. Other speakers spoke about how the stigmata is love and suffering and that with suffering we grow in love; that through transformation, understanding, and love, God allows all of us to share in His love. One speaker stated that the lesson to be learned from the stigmata is total conformity to

Christ—to Christ on the cross and the merciful love that flows from the crucified Christ.

This two hour celebration began with Mass and included the celebration of the stigmata at La Verna, the place where Francis received the wounds of Christ

From this opening of the celebration of the Stigmata of St. Francis, we as fraternities will initiate actions to meet the objectives for celebrating the gift of the Stigmata. During this year as we reflect on the Stigmata of St. Francis, the readings and resources of the Secular Franciscan Order-USA, invite us to prayerful and contemplative silence in our daily lives; a silence that allows us to listen to ourselves, to others, and to God. Like Francis we can make listening a way of life. In The Life of St. Francis by Thomas of Celano, the Second Book, Chapter II, he writes: ... "He found it easier to do what is perfect than to talk about it; so he was constantly active in showing his zeal and dedicaion in deeds, not in words, because words do not do what is good, they only point to it. ..."
