


MINISTER ISRAELA GARCIA, OSF, TO SERVE ON CENTENARIES TASK FORCE

The National Executive Council of the National Fraternity of the Secular Franciscan Order of the USA has appointed our Minister Israela, along. with Vickie Klick, OFS, Chair, Deacon Terry Barber OFS; Patrick Martin OFS; Carolyn Townes, OFS; and Terri Leone, OFS to the Centenaries Task Force from 2023 to 2026. The Conference of the Franciscan Family has Created guidelines for organizing the Franciscan Centenaries. This will be a celebration of the five significant events in the life of St. Francis. These



are: The Rule (1223-2023), Christmas at Greccio (1223-2023), Stigmata (1224-2024), Canticle of Creation (1225-2025), and Easter of St. Francis (1226-2026). The members of the Centenaries Task Force will review the guidelines; create a plan for national activities (Zoom or possibly at Chapter) for each theme; and will create a calendar of national and regional events.

Israela said regarding her service on this task force, "I am honored and a bit nervous to dive into this task. I know I have the support of our Fraternity, the Region, and our Franciscan brothers and sisters throughout the world who are praying constantly for each other, and that gives me peace. I appreciate all of you who reached out to offer your help. I will take you upon on your offers. Please send me any ideas you may have so that we can begin to create the 800th year Franciscan celebrations ever! I will be sharing continuously with the Task Force as we begin to put our ideas into motion. I would like to thank Jane DeRose-Bamman and the National Executive Council for entrusting me and the other appointees with this opportunity to serve our Franciscan Family."

Fraternity Gathering - January 22, 2023

We opened our gathering with Rena Xuereb and Marilyn Migliarini leading the Evening Liturgy of the Hours. The Liturgy was beautiful with our petition prayer response: "Renew the wonders of your love, Lord." May we follow St. Francis' example, and be Our Lord's ears, mouth, hands and feet to Renew the wonders of Our Lord's Love.

Reflecting on the gathering I found that the theme of UNITY flowed throughout our gathering. How better to renew the wonders of our Lord's love than by being united—serving in Unity. Our gathering demonstrated to us how the Franciscan Family's charism calls us to unity and growth.

Our Minister, Israela Garcia, shared letters from the National Fraternity and from the Conference of the Franciscan Family. Israela said we are being called to increase vocations, consecrations, and servant leadership. She also announced the invitation from the International Council to attend the Chapter of Mats in Rome in November 2024.

Israela called on Adrian Montoya to share his experience

Attending the Council Meeting as part of his Candidacy Formation. He shared his experience and expressed his gratitude to the Council for their hard work.

Ed Dzienis read two letters, one announcing the appointment of Israela to the Franciscan Centenaries Task Force; and the other announcing the 800th year anniversary celebrating the major events in the life of our Seraphic Father St. Francis and the years of the event's occurrence with the corresponding year for celebration: Later Rule 1223-2023; Christmas at Greccio 1223-2023; Stigmata 1224-2024; Canticle of Creation 1225-2025; Easter of St. Francis 1226-2026.

Continuing with the theme of Unity, the letter from the Conference of the Franciscan Family was an excellent example of our unity as a Franciscan Family. It was signed by the Friar Minors, the Capuchins, the Conventuals, the Third Order Regulars, and the Secular Order Franciscans. Brother Gordon gave us an excellent recap and examples on the various Orders in our Franciscan Family. He spoke about the Poor Clares in Roswell who are cloistered and continuously pray for us; the Province of Order of Friars Minor here in Albuquerque who offer masses for us and officiate at our professions.



Spiritual assistant's Message

Dearest sisters and brothers in St. Francis—

It's a comin'! LENT, that is. How 'bout we think *twice* about this season, instead of doing the same 'ol things.

Too often, our minds are distracted (or latched onto) the wording of the Ten Commandments *only* to base our penitential spirituality. But as mature Christians, these guidelines *should be . . .* rudimentary. Many (most?) of us can check off several of the Ten as never did (and never would do) that.

However, if/when we page forward to the Gospels, dispersed throughout, we read of the Commands of Jesus (*for example*, Mt. 4:17, 5:44-45, 16:24-25, 28:8-9; Lk. 21:29-36; Jn 13:34-35, 14:11, 14--to list a few). And, let us also recall "The Lord's Prayer", "The Beatitudes", and most importantly, "The Last Final Judgement (Mt. 25: 31-46).

In these versus we are challenged to grow beyond our hands pressed together in prayer. We are called to trust the power of prayer (like the Apostles in Pentecost) leave the "Upper Room" of our lives and enter the marketplace to give witness to the "Good-God News".

As Franciscans of Penitence, let us gain strength in our prayerful numbers from our Gatherings to move from "Gospel to life".

"From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." (Mt. 4:17) "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes the sun rise on the bad and the good and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust." (Mt. 5:44-45) Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Mt. 16: 24-25) Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed, and ran to announce this to his disciples. And behold, Jesus met them on their way and greeted them. They approached, embraced his feet, and did him homage. (Mt. 28:8-9)



February 22 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, During this time we commemorate what Jesus went through during His forty days in the desert. He not only fasted but had to endure Satan's taunting. (Luke 4:1-9)

So the season of praying, fasting, and almsgiving will have us adjusting our focus and perspective in these areas.

The Lenten season will have many of us preparing Lenten meals. You may have a recipe or two you may want to share with our brothers and sisters at the Fraternity Gathering on February 26. Here are recipes for three traditional New Mexican Lenten foods.

Torrejas 3 eggs, 4 tbs flour, 2 tsp salt, 1/2 tsp baking powder, lard or shortening, 3 cups red chile sauce.

Separate eggs; beat whites until stiff, beat yolks and add to whites, Mix well; add flour, sifted with baking powder and salt, mix well and add to eggs. He enough lard or shortening in a skillet so that it is about 2 inches deep. Drop the egg mixture by tablespoons into hot grease. Brown on both sides. Drain on paper towels. Heat the red chile sauce and drop the torrejas into the chile sauce. Simmer gently for about 10 minutes.

Quelites 1 pound fresh spinach, 1 the shortening, 3 the chopped onion, 1/2 teas crushed red chile, salt to taste.

Wash spinach well, chop coarsely and steam about 10 minutes or until tender. Saute the onion in shortening, mix in drained spinach, chile, and salt, and cook for an additional 5 minutes.

Sopa – Capirotada 1 cup sugar, 2 cups water, 6 slices toasted bread (toast bread in oven), 2 tbs butter, 1 tsp cinnamon, 1-1/2 cup grated longhorn cheese, 1 cup raisins.

Caramelize sugar, add water and cinnamon and boil until sugar is dissolved. Place a layer of bread in a casserole dish; add cheese and raisins. Repeat until all ingredients are used. Add butter. Pour caramelized syrup over mixture and bake in 325 degree oven until the syrup all absorbed by the bread.
