Minister's Message



HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA
HE IS RISEN INDEED! ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA!

Happy Easter, brothers and sisters in Francis!

I hope that you all had a very special Lenten season and that you received the news of His Resurrection as joyfully as I... Thank God for the wonder of life and for the miraculous ways that He shows Himself to us every day.

As some of you may know, my brother (Joshua) fell twenty feet from a rooftop as he was finishing up the servicing of the five air conditioners at my dance studio. This happened on Friday of the week before Holy Week. I was in a Fraternity Council Meeting when I got the frantic call that Joshua had fallen from the roof and that paramedics were on their way. I was in shock and I went back to the meeting and sat down.

It was quiet for a moment. Brother Gordon led us in a special prayer for Joshua, we quickly finished the meeting and I rushed to the hospital. When I got to the Emergency Room window, they could not find his name in the computer. After more searching, the gentleman at the desk looked at me kindly and said he would take me to him. This gesture ignited an uproar from the waiting room as people yelled that they were there first or that they had someone back there too. I was briskly escorted through the double doors and through a hallway jam packed with suffering people that were in pain because of gashes, broken limbs and so many other horrible things. I wondered why this nice man was so quiet and just led me patiently back to a private, dimly lit room.

My brother was lying down and in a brace. His eyes were closed. I placed my hand on his and told him that I was with him. He opened his eyes and I asked him how he was doing and he said he was doing fine. He was talking just fine and I sat next to him as we talked for the next 7-8 hours. He had an MRI, a CT scan, some X-rays and blood draws every hour. In between this busyness, there was a calm that I cannot put into words. We talked about life and death, what would happen if... We talked about how in the split second that he fell to the ground, he remembered what our father had told him as a little boy. He told him that if he was ever falling from a high place, that he should turn to the side and completely relax his body.

(Our father was a paratrooper in WWII.) Fifty years after Joshua heard that advice, he remembered it in the split second that he needed it. When he fell, he fell in a tiny space between a huge boulder and the building. He was knocked out for a while, but walked himself to the ambulance.

Minister's Message-Continued

We talked a lot about God and His will for us. We talked about our faith and so many other things... We talked about our mother, how we felt her presence and how much we love her. He told me I didn't have to stay – that I could go home to which I told him that I wasn't leaving.

In the early morning, different doctors came in and told us that they could find NOTHING WRONG with him. They said that they had never treated a fall that hadn't resulted in either death, severe injuries or handicap. The only thing they were able to find was that he was low on potassium for which they wanted to give him some capsules. I told them that he had fasted that day and they said that was probably why he was low on potassium. They offered him pain meds or a prescription for pain meds and my brother said: "No, thank you." They smiled as they told him that he could go home. I made Joshua some hot chocolate and toast as the sun was coming up and I went to my altar, got on my knees and emotionally praised my Lord and my God. There is a reason Joshua is here. There is a reason we are all here. In the light of the Resurrection, we are all made new. Let us not waste the opportunity.



Reflecting on the Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order

Rule Four

The rule and life of the Secular Franciscans is this: to observe the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ by following the example of Saint Francis of Assisi, who made Christ the inspiration and the center of his life with God and people6. Christ, the gift of the Father's love, is the way to him, the truth into which the Holy Spirit leads us, and the life which he has come to give abundantly7. Secular Franciscans should devote themselves especially to careful reading of the gospel, going from gospel to life and life to the gospel.

Commentary (Official Commentary prepared by the USA National Spiritual Assistants' Commission.)

4. The second chapter of the rule is a thorough and detailed description of the Secular Franciscan way of life. The first part (#4½#6) gives the meaning of gospel living in the Franciscan tradition. Then conversion and worship are explained as the necessary preconditions for achieving this gospel life (#7½#8). Finally, paragraphs #9½#19 describe the manner of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ by how the Secular Franciscans live (#10½#14) and what they do (#15½#19). In the light of scripture and the teachings of Vatican II, this chapter is envisioned as a program for evangelization: how we ourselves are evangelized after the manner of Francis and secondly how we evangelize others.

Paragraph #4 summarizes the heart of the rule: the very core of gospel life is intimate union with Christ, or in the words of St. Paul, "the life I live now is not my own; Christ is living in me" (Gal 3:20). And so, the Secular Franciscan, alive with the spirit of Francis, knows and experiences the Lord Jesus intensely, binding one's own person with the person of Christ.
